Featured Saint of the Week

St. Germaine Cousin (1579-1601) Feast Day: June 15

Germaine lost her mother while she was still an infant. Her father, Laurent, married a new woman (Hortense), to replace his first wife. From the first time she met Germaine, sparks flew! Germaine was born with a deformed and paralyzed right hand, and Hortense was very vocal about how much she hated her. She was both cruel and abusive to her until the day Germaine died.



Adding to the pain, her father Laurent was weak in character and overlooked the indignities his daughter was experiencing. If and when they did feed her, it was with meager scraps. If Hortense took the child with her on a walk, sometimes she wouldn't bring her home. She'd leave her out in the elements for a couple of days. When boiling water was poured over her legs, her father still said nothing.

Germaine was told to sleep in the barn; she had only the sheep she was tending to help keep her warm during frigid temperatures. She slept on a bed of straw and soon became ill, having contracted a form of tuberculosis.

Hortense started treating her slightly better, but only because she was afraid that her own children might get the disease. Hortense's kids joined in the abuse by doing things like adding ashes to her food.

Being alone so much each day, Germaine developed a deep relationship with God through prayer. She made a rosary out of string, but her main refuge was attending daily Mass. She would leave the sheep behind while she went to worship. Despite all of the harsh treatment, Germaine kept a pleasant outlook.

In 1601, Germaine was found dead in her straw bed at the age of 22, overcome by a life of suffering. Forty years later, she was exhumed and found to still be intact.

Germaine did no heroic deeds, nor did she start a religious order. This is one of many saints who truly just gave of themselves and turned their lives over to God. God accepted Germaine for who she was. What an example of true love!

Silver Rose Ceremony Thursday, November 14 at 12 PM Mass

In 1531, Mexican peasant Juan Diego received a message from a mysterious woman twice. The second time, she told Juan Diego to go to the top of a nearby hill and pick the roses there. He placed them in his tilma and returned to the lady, who arranged the roses and instructed him to ask the bishop to build a church there. In the presence of the bishop, Juan Diego opened his tilma.



The roses fell to the floor, revealing the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe on his tilma. The bishop ordered the construction of a church to begin immediately.

In 1960, the Knights of Columbus began transferring a rose from the U.S. to Mexico for the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The program began with a natural rose to commemorate the miracle of the roses. Since then, the rose has been changed from natural to wood, bronze, and finally, silver. Each year from early March through mid-December, silver roses are stewarded by Knights of Columbus councils along routes from Canada to Mexico. Every stop the silver rose makes is a rosary-centered occasion for Knights, parishioners, and community members to pray for respect for life and for the spiritual renewal of each nation.

If so, do not miss this opportunity for early detection of a possibly serious disease. These screenings are typically NOT performed at your annual check-up, and insurance companies may not pay for them unless you are symptomatic. Stroke Scan Plus will be offering them to you for \$169 for all 7 combined ultrasound screenings (Stroke, AAA, Thyroid, Liver, Kidneys, and Gallbladder). Blood testing will incur an additional cost. Insurance is NOT necessary, and appointments are limited.
