

The Joy of Christmas is Shared By Many Countries and Customs

In the past, I have shared some reflections on the customs of other countries that bring great joy and meaning to the event of Christmas. Many of them are ancient in origin, not specifically Christian in origin, but today are a central part of what the celebration of Christmas brings to our lives.

Some Christian countries have very different traditions than the United States. In Ireland, for example, we celebrate Christmas much like what we do in the U.S. and the U.K., but the Irish do have some of their own customs. For Irish people who are Catholic, Christmas lasts from Christmas Eve through the Feast of the Epiphany on January 6th, which is called little Christmas or women's Christmas. Part of the Irish tradition is to place a candle on each window in the house after sunset on Christmas Eve and leave it burning all night, which represents a welcoming light for Mary and Joseph. In Irish or Gaelic culture, Christmas is called Nollaig and Santa Claus is known as San Nicocia or Saint Nicholas. Merry Christmas is "Nollaig Shona Dhuit." The traditional meal for Christmas is turkey and a round cake full of caraway seeds. Beef spiced over several days is also served by many.

The day after Christmas, St. Stephen's Day is also very important in Ireland. Like in England, football games and horse racing are traditional sports the days following Christmas. Wren boys play music and go from home to home collecting money for a neighborhood party which will be held later. People dress up in costumes, and they sing and dance in each house they visit. The custom is ancient and has much history to it.

In Germany, a big part of Christmas is Advent, especially with different types of Advent calendars and cards. Christmas trees are very big in Germany. Traditionally, the tree is brought into the home on Christmas Eve. The family would decorate it and read Bible verses. Christmas Eve is when families would exchange gifts. They have a different custom on St. Nicholas Day, December 6th, when Santa Claus brings little gifts to children in the form of sweets, etc. However, larger gifts are not brought to children until December 24th.

In Italy, the most important way of celebrating Christmas is using the Nativity crib to help tell the story, which was made popular by St. Francis Assisi. The city of Naples is world-famous for cribs and crib-making. The tradition goes back before St. Francis to 1025. In Italy, the cribs are traditionally put out on December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, but the Christ child is not put in until Christmas Eve. Naples is home to the largest crib in the world with over 600 pieces. A long tradition in Italy was that no food was eaten until after Midnight Mass.

In France, a Nativity crib was often used to decorate the house. Many French cribs have clay figures in them, not wooden ones. There is a tradition in France where cherry logs are often sprinkled with wine to make the log smell nice while burning. The log and candles are left burning with food and drinks in case Mary and baby Jesus pass by during the night. Again, like in Italy, the main meal is eaten after Midnight Mass.

Many of our American traditions come our way from English Victorian Christmas, such as described by Charles Dickens in "A Christmas Carol." Singing carols, giving gifts, and wishing of good cheer to all come from this period. From the British, we get the story and custom of hanging stockings on the mantel. Most of the popular Christmas carols that we sing today were written in the nineteenth century. The hanging of greens and holly ivy are all British traditions, many of them having origins before the Christian era.

From the customs of these countries, we are reminded of the sacredness of the season and its purpose in our lives. While many of these customs may have a non-Christian origin, all of them were introduced in order to express awe and respect for God's love and His entry into our lives. On behalf of the staff, I wish you all a peaceful and blessed Christmas.

A Minute with the Deacon

How can a saint in heaven, like Mary or any other saint, hear and understand the prayers of millions of Catholics in many different languages being offered at the same time?

Only God is omnipotent (all-powerful), but those in heaven share in His divinity. They are not limited by our time and our space; nor are they limited to understanding one language. In this article “How Can the Saints Hear Us? Because God is Able!,” Msg. Charles Pope indicates that we must not think that the saints in heaven hear the way we hear or think the way we think. Their bodies have not yet risen [with the exception of Mary], so they no longer have ears like we have or minds like ours. Referring to those in heaven, he states, “While we do not know all of the aspects of a glorified humanity, we will surely not have the forgetful and slow minds we have now. Neither, ought we presume that our hearing will be limited as it is now.”

While on earth, the saints performed many good deeds helping their neighbors. Would God want these acts of love to stop with their death on earth? I doubt it. The saints are closer to God than we are, so they can intercede for us. St. Thomas Aquinas in his Summa Theologica states that the souls of the saints retain the love of their neighbor, and “it is to be believed that they help their neighbor very much by interceding for him [or her] to God.”

If God can create this world out of nothing, certainly He can give those in heaven the ability to listen to and understand a finite number of prayers at the same time.


