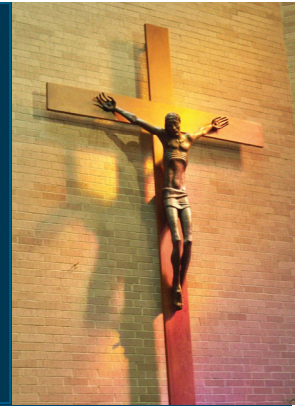

Advent a Time to Reflect with Prayer

With the Advent season right here, we can find ourselves very ill prepared for the celebration of the great event of Christmas.

We can feel very frustrated because we let the opportunity to grow closer to God slip away one more time. However, it is never too late. God is always waiting for us and always loving us. Many times we have a pretty good notion of what we will do for Lent, but Advent is often lost for us because it comes between Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Yes, it comes in that busy time of the year when shopping and all of those holiday events occupy our minds. The time we spend in prayer can be a time of self-renewal and a place where we can find some personal peace.

Thomas Merton, one of the great spiritual writers of this century, wrote, "In prayer we discover what we already have. It is there all the time, and if we give it time, it will make itself known to us. Many use our Adoration Chapel to do this - it is open 24/7.

Prayer can, and often does, bring us to know the God of surprise. Yes, God has that way of surprising us if we give him a chance. Celebrating the sacrament of Reconciliation can just be a wonderful way to experience God's love and forgiveness during the season of Advent. By taking time to pray, we are following Christ. Not only are we learning to be his disciples, but also we are sharing our experience of God. Prayer is an acknowledgement that all we are and all we possess are gifts from God. Give it a chance and you will enjoy it. Have a blessed Advent Season. May God bless you.

The Anointing of the Sick

The Anointing of the Sick will take place following the 4:00 PM Mass on Saturday, December 2nd

Like all of the seven sacraments, it was instituted by Jesus Christ during His earthly ministry. The catechism of the church explains it this way: "This sacred Anointing of the Sick was instituted by Christ Our Lord as a true and proper sacrament of the New Testament. It is alluded to indeed by Mark, but it is recommended to the faithful and promulgated by James the apostle in the early church." Mark 6:13 says, "They drove out many demons, and anointed many who were sick and cured them." James 5:14-15 says, "Is anyone among you sick? They should send for the priest of the church, and he should pray over the person and anointing the person with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer offered in faith will save the sick person and the Lord will raise the person up. If the person has committed any sins, they will be forgiven."

The question often asked is does a person have to be dying to receive this sacrament. No, the Catechism of the church says, "The Anointing of the Sick is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or age, the fitting time for a person to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived" (CCC 1514).

I would like to add to this clarification that this sacrament is what many refer to as "Last Rites." So if you, yourself, feel the need for this sacrament, please call me or if someone in your family is ill and needs to receive it, please call. And if possible, do not wait to call for when the situation is immediate and it is not possible for a priest to get there. Only a priest can celebrate this sacrament. A deacon cannot since he cannot hear confessions and give absolution which is part of the sacrament for a person who is close to death. I recommend that you call the church as soon as the person becomes ill and is in danger of dying so that I can take care of this for the sick person while he or she can still participate in this very special sacrament of the sick. Many thanks for your understanding.

Stump the Deacon

Why are there only seven sacraments?

The Councils of Lyons (1274) and Florence (1438 - 1445) taught there are only seven sacraments, the ones we know today. The Council of Trent reiterated this teaching in response to Protestant rejection of some of the sacraments.

So, why only seven? Let's look at the definition of sacraments. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* defines sacraments as "...efficacious [effective] signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us. The visible rites by which the sacraments are celebrated signify and make present the graces proper to each sacrament (CCC 1131). When we look at this definition, the number of sacraments become clearer. For instance, baptism was instituted by Christ to convey grace or divine life (Mt 28:19; 1 Pt 3:21). The visible sign of baptism is water that is poured over the head or water where one is fully immersed, as well as the words spoken, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Baptism, therefore, fits the definition of a sacrament. Other rituals, such as Jesus washing the feet of His Apostles, were established by Christ, but do not convey grace, so they are not sacraments. Other devotions, such as the Stations of the Cross, may be an occasion of grace but were not instituted by Christ; therefore, they are not sacraments.

Seven rituals of the Catholic Church fit the definition of a sacrament: Baptism, Confirmation, the Eucharist, Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders, and Matrimony.

From Bishop Robert Muench

Today St. Joseph Seminary College is the largest Catholic seminary college in the United States with over 140 students from 22 dioceses in seven states. Given the urgent need for priests, the continued contribution of the monks of the abbey is invaluable.

Now, however, it is the monks who are in need. In March 2016, a disastrous flood overwhelmed the abbey and seminary. In all, 30 buildings on the campus received at least two feet of water. The damage is estimated in the millions of dollars. In order for the monks of the abbey to continue their mission of forming seminarians for the priesthood, they will need the generous help of the people of the Dioceses of Louisiana.

This year, after consultation with the Diocesan Presbyteral Council, I have authorized a special collection to benefit the abbey and seminary. This collection will be taken up in all churches of the diocese on the weekend of December 9th and 10th. This special collection will take the place of the annual collection for retired religious, which our diocese has always been extremely generous in response.
